# **Covid Update**

Below is a snippet directly from Tennis NSW regarding COVID-19 updates. For more info please click <u>here</u>.

### **COVID-19 UPDATE AS AT 17 DECEMBER**

"Tennis NSW understands that community sport, including local competition can return to 'normal' activities. However, it is noted that there is a requirement for masks to be worn by anyone **not fully vaccinated** aged over 12 years working in hospitality who is dealing directly with members of the public. Any of our members operating a food and drink premises at their venue should review the requirements in the current PHO as to whether they are required to have their workers wear masks while working.

We take this opportunity to remind you of the important decision made by the Tennis NSW Board that all players who enter and compete in all Tennis NSW endorsed and approved events and leagues (whether junior or open) will be required to adhere to the following guidelines until further notice:

- Players aged 16 and over are fully vaccinated or have a medical exemption.
- Players under 16 are not required to be vaccinated, however must be accompanied by a fully vaccinated parent/guardian who resides at the same place of residence. If the parent/guardian cannot attend, the player can attend with a vaccinated guardian/coach, provided the player resides with a vaccinated parent/guardian."

# **The Tony Gilbert Show Court**

### The Future of our Comps!

Eastwood Thornleigh District Tennis Association began at the Midson Road Courts in Epping at a time when many homes had their own backyard courts to contribute to competition play. The trend to sell off these courts, for building blocks, made it mandatory for the Association to find land on which to construct a larger tennis centre on which to continue. The late Tony Gilbert led this search, and when the disused softball diamonds in PHPTC were offered by HSC, Tony designed and oversaw the construction of, eventually, all 16 courts and the clubhouses. He also oversaw maintenance for many years. Tony was made a Life Member of the Association for his many contributions, and the newly constructed grandstand was named after him amidst much fanfare.

Alas, the grandstand was demolished, and although its plaque is attached to the clubhouse, it is easily overlooked. In order to remind people of Tony's efforts it was decided to name Court 6 as "The Tony Gilbert Show Court" as a reminder of his contributions.

On Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> January the Show Court plaque will be unveiled and you are welcome to attend this at 4pm. So come along - Meg, Tony's wife and also a Life Member, will unveil the plaque, and family, friends and former tennis players of the time have been invited to witness the event. It is hoped that some of Tony's family will be able to take to the court on the occasion.
