

Dedication of the Stan Hicks Tennis Court – Court 5

Today we gather to honour a man whose legacy is woven deeply into the fabric of this club — Stan Hicks — and to dedicate Court Number 4 as the **Stan Hicks Tennis Court**.

For those who knew Stan, he was remembered not just as a fine tennis player, but as an affable man, always with a smile on his face. Someone who loved the game, loved the people around it, and gave generously of his time and energy.

I want to be open in saying that, as President of ETDTA, I never had the privilege of knowing Stan personally. But when someone's name continues to come up decades later — spoken with respect, warmth and admiration — you quickly understand the impact they had. Stan's legacy speaks clearly for itself.

On the court, Stan was an exceptional competitor. Between 1955 and 1977, he won an extraordinary **12 District Championships** — an achievement that reflects not only talent, but dedication and longevity in the game.

Off the court, Stan's contribution to this association was just as significant. He served as **Vice President from 1983 to 1985**, and later as **President from 1987 to 1990**, guiding the club through important years of growth. In recognition of his service, he was rightly made a **Life Member**.

Stan was also the **first manager and coach of Pennant Hills Park Tennis Centre** — helping to establish the foundations on which we continue to build today.

Naming this court in Stan's honour ensures that his contribution is not just remembered, but lived — every rally, every match, every new generation that steps onto this surface.

It is entirely fitting that Court 4 now carries his name.
