## President's Report 2021/22

There is a proverb that goes it takes a village to raise a child, the same could be said for running a successful community-based tennis association such as ours. Everyone who helps in any capacity is making a valuable contribution to who we are and our future.

As most members are aware we are on the cusp of celebrating our Centenary Year, a remarkable achievement given the changing nature of community tennis over the years, and it is thanks to the great work of volunteers, dedicated staff and support from our local community.

Despite the curve balls that the weather and Covid has again thrown at us: our membership has remained above 1,000, our competitions and social play options have bounced back, and we have had the financial capacity to continue to reinvest in the wonderful tennis facilities that we have been entrusted with.

In December last we were able to hold our delayed North West Sydney Tennis naming Gala Day and were very pleased that two of our long-standing patrons and supporters, Mr Julian Leeser the Federal Member for Berowra and Mr Philip Ruddock the Mayor of Hornsby Shire Council were able to share the unveiling honours of the new signage.

Another important event, the naming of court 6 as the Tony Gilbert Show Court was held in May this year to acknowledge Tony Gilbert and those who worked with him to build our wonderful 16 court tennis complex on the edge of Lane Cove National Park. We are thankful that Tony and his helpers had the vision and drive to recognise that the tennis competitions were changing from being run on peoples' backyard courts to those at a dedicated facility. As an Association it is an important lesson that continuing to evolve and invest is an important key to our future.

In the last 12 months we have completed the upgrade of our fencing at Pennant Hills Park so that all the court fencing is now coated black to blend into the environment and we undertook root removal that was encroaching underneath a number of courts. The Council of Management (CoM) is in the process of installing a state of the art hitting wall to be located next to court 8. We have had great support for this initiative with the local, state and federal governments and Tennis NSW all committing funds to assist us. At the Midson Road centre we utilised left over grant money to assist purchase a new water fountain and have recently replaced the playing surface on court 2 with assistance of the NSW government.

2022 has been another great team effort and there are many people that I would like to thank. A sincere thanks to all members of the CoM who regularly attend meetings, shared their skills and knowledge and are the core of our volunteers and members of our various sub-committees. A special thanks to the Executive of the CoM, Mary Baker and Kaye McIntyre our two Vice Presidents, Clare Perry our Secretary and Dennis Pike our Treasurer for their

energy and passion in assisting to lead the Association and the great support from Andy Kleiberg (our newest life member) and Anne Wallis (also our diligent bookkeeper) who are the Assistant Treasurer and Assistant Secretary.

A big thank you also for our amazing Competitions Secretaries Penny Ryan, Robyn Johnson, Marina Hurst and John Phare who run the weekly adult competitions and have juggled draws amongst disruptions from Covid and wet weather, allowing many of us to simply turn up, play and enjoy our tennis. Thank you to Dave Cochrane for his great work and assistance supporting the implementation of Xpoint for some of our competition formats. Thank you also to those of you who help in the background whether it is around the grounds or making wonderful coffees, such as Brian Tierney and Danny Hipolito.

I would like to acknowledge our Manager Sandi Edwards and her team for their ongoing commitment and flexibility to keep the centres open through the Covid-19 periods and running our Junior Saturday competitions. We ask all members to be respectful of our staff who often have to deal with weather events or IT matters that are outside their control. We farewelled Jack Inwood, a valuable staff member for many years and welcomed Andy Phelan as a grounds person assisting Craig Edwards and Henry Chim, Abigail Gosling and Tyrese San Diego joining Julia Dolahenty in the Pro Shop.

Finally I would like to thank our coaching partners Voyager Tennis Academy and Paul Toohey Tennis and our financial sponsors TAG Financial and Fleet Street Merchants for their valued support and ask that members take the opportunity to consider their services.

Next year is our Centenary Year and we ask all our members and court hirers for any support they can provide to assist us celebrate our Centenary Year in style in 2023.







Once again, we have pleasure in reporting to the members that we had a strong financial result for the year ended 30 June 2022. Our surplus shows an audited result of \$104,188 which is marginally above last year with an increase of \$5,799.

We have continued to provide for capital provisions increasing the provision by a further \$40,054.

Grants were received from several partners that assisted us to carry out further improvements both to the Pennant Hills and Epping complexes.







#### **Income**

Covid-19 & wet weather had adversely affected our ability to run special events as well as general bookings. Despite this our income from court rental is up 14% on last year. Membership fees were down slightly. The Pro Shop suffered by the lack of general activity at Pennant Hills recording a reduction in income. Grants were also down and there was no direct Government Covid assistance.

#### **Expenses**

Expenses were down by \$87,050. There was a large reduction in leasehold improvements and net capital improvement transfers of \$92,640. However, there was a large increase in rent paid due to additional court bookings amounting to \$26,754.

Wages were managed within the guideline set and showed an improvement to total income.

#### Cash

Our bank balance plus our debtors less our creditors showed a positive balance of funds at \$794,082 at 30th June, 2022. This is an increase from last year on the same basis. This clearly shows the strong financial position that the Association is in.

#### Summary

The Association constantly assesses the viability for the future and does not just look back over its shoulder. Our future maintenance cost with 19 courts requiring major works scheduled over a number of years means we need to be adequately providing for this year on year rather than taking big hits in any one year.

We recently undertook a review of our facilities with Tennis NSW who gave us a very high assessment of the condition of the complexes currently and our ability to maintain this for the foreseeable future.

I acknowledge and support our previous treasurer when he stated that our Association doesn't only depend on its financial situation. We extend thanks to its members, the CoM, the Executives and its sub-committees. I would personally like to thank that group for the support they have given me over the year. In particular, I would like to acknowledge the excellent work of Anne Wallis in all her bookkeeping and support work and the assistance of the previous treasurer, Andy Kleiberg.

## WhatsApp and new tennis formats at NWST

With a forever changing world the Association is embracing technology to ensure it is easy for people to communicate and to engage in tennis offers, whether it be a casual social hitting group, or communication sharing within a competition. We are moving with the changes and have adopted WhatsApp as a way of communicating easily.

Our Pro Shop along with volunteers have created three new social offerings:

- Friday Tennis @ Midson Rd
- Weekend Wildcards @ NWST, translated as 'Sunday afternoon tennis', and
- NWST Casual Hitters

Two of these groups alone have resulted in approximately 100 participants so far, which opens the opportunity for people to find out more about NWST and to engage in our offers as well as our membership advantages.

Our Monday Night Ladies competition also has a group messaging service so weather updates and alerts for fill in players can be made directly to the group and sent promptly and easily through WhatsApp.





#### 2022 has been a busy year for us at North West Sydney Tennis!

After many delays we hosted a **Community Fun and Tennis Gala Day** in December 2021. We launched the North West Sydney tennis brand with some fun fare, a sausage or two, community stalls and tennis. Our juniors were featured with the finals of their championships, and we welcomed our local supporters on the day to unveil our new brand. We particularly would like to thank our dedicated volunteers on the day, and also our Federal Member for Berowra Mr Julian Leeser, Hornsby Shire Council Mayor, Mr Philip Ruddock and Councillor Sreeni Pillamarri and the then Tennis NSW CEO Mr Lawrence Robertson.



We also attended the **Hills Parenting Expo** in February to promote the tennis centres to the general public. We combined with Voyager Coaching and Tara from Thrive Collective on the day.







Many past members and their families attended the opening of **The Tony Gilbert Show Court** opening celebration held in May 2022. The late Mr Gilbert was influential in identifying the land held by Hornsby Council and then overseeing the design and construction of the Pennant Hills 16 court complex to accommodate the growing tennis population in the area.

With the lessening of the impacts of Covid-19 we were able to get back to group activities, including community yoga lessons, weekly competitions, and various tournaments and challenges that are offered throughout the year. Some of our offers have included:

• Anyone for Yoga? We have continued our yoga classes at Pennant Hills which has been proving popular not just with our tennis players but local community people, both ladies and men. We use our club house facilities and outdoor areas when appropriate, and we continue to offer three different class times during the week with classes taking up to 15 people.

• Round Robins for the over 30s. Our weekend round robins conducted with Seniors NSW are run generally twice a year and can attract in the vicinity of 200-300 people from a wide area, although these numbers have been affected by our la Nina weather pattern recently!



Outside tournaments are a privilege to host in our beautiful park surrounds and as an Association we are fortunate to be able to provide our facilities to others. We enjoyed hosting Tennis Sydney which is Australasia's largest LGBQTI+ tennis club's annual tournament and the Australian Chinese Tennis Club too. The 88 Tennis Club this year combined with Sydney Lady Chinese Tennis Club to play the Dragonix Mixed Doubles Tournament.



 The Independent Girls Schools Sporting Association also joined us each year and more recently the local district Primary Catholic Schools gala tennis program is a feature for primary schools in the area.



- And as an Association we never stand still..... we purchased a new state of the art ball machine that is available for hire to members at a discounted rate and have been working on a plan which will result in a state of the art hitting wall that will be available to all at Pennant Hills by the end of 2022. And yes those raffle tickets purchased have gone to assist in the funding for projects such as this.
- As an Association we also have developed a range of community partners at the centres who we acknowledge for their support of us as a not-for-profit community tennis association. Community partnerships are an important way to support each other in the local area and we welcome them to our centre.
- We are fortunate to have TAG Financial who have been a community partner supporting us for the last 18 months and we welcome a new partner, Fleet St Merchants, who have supported us on many occasions with functions that we have held for the community.





 And a well-deserved Life Member Award to the very deserving Andy Kleiberg! Andy has for many years assisted the Association with his Treasurer skills as well as volunteering his time to support various social and tournament events, as well as being available to assist with maintenance, grounds and staff needs when that extra helping hand is needed. Thank you and congratulations Andy.

## Our members and the CoM

Some of these projects have included putting in place Tennis Australia's requirement for us to have specific member protection policies and a safeguarding children policy and even updated evacuation procedures. Competition is an important part of tennis. We have a large number of people that play in our junior summer and winter competitions, various tournaments, adult night and day and badge competitions.

A special mention to our Competition Secretaries, volunteers that assist with the day and night adult competitions, manage between them 89 teams, with 682 players in teams and on pool lists. We thank them for their time and organisation skills - from all 682 players!

### Want to test your skills? Come and join in the Sydney Badge Competition!

This year represents the third consecutive season in which NWST has entered a Men's Sydney Badge Competition team and the first year in which we have a ladies team. Sydney Badge is a fast competitive competition drawing from Clubs across the greater metropolitan area and sees us play four sets of doubles in an afternoon. After the competitive play, we have light refreshments and often discuss our lack of fitness, struggles for movement, and remedies for old age – well some of us!

In previous years the men's team has made the semi-finals of 1.3 grade and hope to be there again this year. Our ladies team is firmly planted in 2nd place with one match to go in 1.4 and we look forward to them bringing home the season with a place in NWST history. No pressure girls....

Contested on Saturdays at 12pm for home matches, and played across other Sydney Tennis Clubs, we enjoy a competitive atmosphere playing a consistently strong standard of tennis. For those looking to reach a larger pool of players to test your skills, Sydney Badge is the largest competition run by Tennis NSW and draws in excess of 800 players from as far South as Wollongong and as far North as Wyong.

#### **Monday Night Ladies**

Due to Covid-19 social distancing restrictions, no competition was played in the later part of 2021. The competition that had begun before the lock down, resumed at the end of January 2022 and that competition was completed prior to Easter 2022.

We began our second competition of 2022 on May 2nd. Our Monday Night Ladies' Competition currently has 22 teams over 3 Divisions, 1 and 2 have 8 teams per Division; Division 3 has 6 teams. This competition will conclude in September and a third competition will begin prior to the summer school holidays. We currently have 120 ladies registered and 20 ladies in the pool. This is a drop in numbers but that is often the case during winter.

There has been a major change in the way our MNL Comp is managed. The CoM decided that our Association should update to a system whereby players can access a UTR. To do this we have implemented Xpoint which allows players to enter scores as each set is completed. This means the weekly work load of the Comp Secretary is greatly reduced. Xpoint allows any player to see at a glance their draw, position on the ladder, individual standings, and results. I have been very happy with the uptake of this new system by the ladies of our Monday Night Comp, after an initial reluctance by some. Nearly every match is now entered during the night or very soon afterwards - if players feel uncertain about entering scores on their phones the home team can use any device with a larger screen at their convenience after the match.

To implement XPoint so successfully I would like to thank Dave Cochrane and Marina Hurst for their guidance and inputs.

As Xpoint does not have a Home Page as such, we have retained the original Monday Night Ladies' website, in parallel with Xpoint where players can view availability of pool players/ 4 Set winners/notices and other information.

We have also recently introduced a WhatsApp group so that any player who has agreed to be part of the group can be informed of court playability re weather conditions, social, grading nights and other notices. There has been a great take up of this system for MNL.

I would like to acknowledge the help I receive from Sandi and her staff, especially Henry, in the Pro Shop at Pennant Hills in respect to team payments/weather updates/phone answering. Thanks also to Judy Halbedl for her tireless work with membership and pool updates. As well I acknowledge the CoM of NWST all of whom work so hard to ensure we can all enjoy tennis. My grateful thanks to all these people.

#### **Ladies Midweek**

The suspended **Autumn competition 2021** recommenced on 1/2/22. A hot and humid day, some teams agreed to stop play and split the remaining sets. Competition continued to be challenging with 2 out of 4 matches rescheduled due to wash outs and points shared. The Tildesley Shield Tournament was scheduled on 15/3, so no competition matches were played on that day. Division 1 & 2 played their semi-finals on 22/3 while Division 3 played match 15 and of course the finals were washed out, rescheduled on 5/4. The results are listed in the competition results area.

In the new **Winter Competition 2022** one of our longstanding Division 3 teams was unable to re-register leaving Division 3 with only 4 teams. To make the overall competition more balanced and fairer for all divisions to enjoy, the LMW committee decided to move teams down between divisions. At the last-minute ladies from our social tennis group were able to form a new Division 3 team, thus allowing Division 1 & 2 teams to remain, and the competition commenced as scheduled on 26/4. 3 Divisions of 8, 7+B, 5+B, consisting of 20 teams, 110 team members, 13 pool players listed making 123 members.

**Xpoint** has been running parallel to our Barefile website page and most teams have been able to enter the order of match players, plus set scores in Xpoint. As there are many differences between the two systems, changes are being discussed to ensure the system is suitable before a decision is made to adopt the Xpoint programme.

With our **Tuesday Morning Ladies social tennis** we rely on the support of our bye teams, pool players and the ladies rostered off to play socially. We encourage new players to join and have advertised on Facebook and in the NWST newsletter. So far two new teams have formed from our pool players and new players have joined via this social group.

After 7 years as LMW Competition Secretary I have decided not to renominate, allowing another person the chance to take up the challenge. It has been enjoyable, sometimes stressful, but overall, a rewarding experience and I will always be grateful for the help, wisdom, and support of the LMW committee Kelley Keyes and Jo Perry, and the various members of the CoM, thank you.

Remember, volunteers make the difference at NWST! It takes many hands to make light work and new volunteers are always welcome to join the committee and lend a hand.

#### **Wednesday Night Mixed**

Our Autumn competition commenced on 5th May 2021. Due to Covid-19 lockdown our regular competition was suspended after our match on 23rd June 2021.

In November 2021, as our current competitions were not running, the association ran **WNX Covid Cup (CV)**. We had three divisions, two with 4 pairs and one division with 6 pairs. It was a social competition and accepted well by everyone. For most people this was the first tennis they had played since our competition was suspended in June. We also introduced our new scoring system Xpoint sports to this competition.

We recommenced our suspended Autumn competition on 2nd February 2022 and picked up from where we left off. This comp ran through till 4th May 2022.

Our current comp started on 11th May 2022. We have four divisions, 1 division with 7 teams and a bye and 3 divisions with 6 teams. We had three teams pull out from the Autumn competition. We then created two new teams with new players to fill the gaps in Division 3 and 4.

We currently have 155 team members, 29 pool players and occupy 13 courts. We are currently running two scoring systems side by side, Barefile on our website and Xpoint. Most players are getting use to Xpoint and entering their own scores, either on the night or the next day. I would like to thank everyone for moving with the times and learning the new system.

I would like to acknowledge and thank Judy Halbedl for all the help and support she gives me on a weekly basis. Judy assists by entering the weekly results into one scoring system and collects the scores cards when I am not playing. Also, to Mary Baker for her continual and ongoing support, Dave Cochrane for his expertise with Xpoint. Henry, Julia and Sandi in the Pro Shop for their ongoing help and updating me when the weather is not looking great. To the many people, Mary and Gerry Baker, Judy Halbedl, Melissa Dolahenty, Kelly Keyes who assist me with grading on our **social/grading nights** which we run at least once every school holiday and they appear to be a real hit. I am getting more and more new people contacting me enquiring about our WNX competition. It is great to see, and I believe people are keen to get out and on the court after the Covid lockdown.

#### **Saturday Junior Competition**

Our Saturday juniors continues to be a popular option for juniors from around our district. It is well supported by various independent coaches in smaller centres around the north west of Sydney and we thank them for their on-going support.

We were able to hold a competition in term 1 2022 with 69 teams and 138 players participating.

From the end of term 1 we have initiated a winter and summer competition rather than school term based to be in line with other sports. Our first winter competition started in May and will continue through to September. We have 152 registered players, 9 divisions, aged from 8 -18 years, comprising 100 males and 52 female players. The format is best of 9 game sets. There are 3 time slots of 8am, 10am and 3pm match times. All have 3 players per team, graded P1, P2, P3 giving a mix of opponents for the second doubles set.

With the oversubscription for the 3pm match time, we also created a 1pm timeslot. Based on number of players in this division, we used the 2 players per team format, graded as P1 and P2. They play 1 x singles set and 2 x doubles sets. Format is first to 6 games.

#### Interdistrict

Cancelled in 2021 but we have been busy planning for 2022/23. We are looking forward to working with our coaching partner, Voyager Tennis Academy and jointly entering 18 teams for next year.

#### **Competition Challenges and Tournaments**

We were pleased in early 2022 that we were able to have both the Primary Schools and Secondary Schools challenges and welcomed a terrific group of high schools and primary schools.

#### **Junior Age Championships**

Unfortunately, we were not able to run our Junior Age Championship in 2021/22 due to Covid-19.

## Membership

Due to the unusual circumstances affecting last year i.e. a pandemic, we saw a slight decrease in overall members renewing their membership, no doubt for a variety of reasons.

But we attracted 157 new adult members and 17 new senior members, which represents 16% growth in new members. Our total number of members therefore reached 1,054 for the 2021/22 FY. This number comprised 544 adults, 264 seniors and 246 juniors.

Overall, the total membership that we retained in 2021/22 was a great result considering that Covid restrictions in the first half of the financial year meant that our usual activities were severely curtailed.

#### **Treasurers Report**

You must be surprised to hear from me again. I have been promising the last 2 years that I wouldn't be the one to present the annual financial report and here I am back again. So, the inference might be don't believe anything I tell you. I hope that you accept my excuses for this and please at least believe the finance report prepared for you.

As written a good year for the Association despite the Covid-19 issue or may be because of it.

We haven't seen such an increase in court hire for a while, but it might be too early to conclude a resurgence in tennis but may be the increase is because of the present circumstances regarding the restrictions around the Covid-19.

As a not-for-profit Association, any surplus and amalgamated surpluses need to be re-invested in the Association. So at the end of the last financial year we had a reservation for future capital investment of \$195,808 and a retained surplus of \$377,000 totalling \$572,808 to be re-invested into the Association for future needs, modernisation and expansion. This is a very good position to be in and shows a healthy Association and should give our Lessors sufficient basis to consider us for a new lease or agreement.

I like to emphasize that the financial strength of the Association is just a reflection of the way the Association is run it is not a form of creative accounting, but it represents a true reflection of the people who are running the Association.

Again, I am happy to tell you that this year I am taking a back seat and will accept the role of Assistant Treasurer and let the present and coming financial years in the capable hands of Dennis Pike our new Treasurer. I have enjoyed the role over the last years which was made very easy for me by Anne Wallis who has been a treasure for the Association in keeping all these figures and protocols all together.
