# North West Sydney Tennis – Gears Up for the Tildesley Shield




# Tildesley Shield ~Past Winners and Most Improved~


~ PSSA Grading- A Junior Pathway~

On Wednesday 26 February, NWST, in conjunction with Beecroft Public Primary School, ran the Beecroft Zone Tennis Trials. These tennis trials are part of a pathway that provides high-performing tennis athletes opportunities to compete at the top level within the NSW Public School system.

The top 3 boys and 3 girls from the Beecroft Zone Tennis Competition progress to compete at the Sydney North trials held in Gosford.

As the name implies "Interdistrict" gives yellow ball players the opportunity to represent their district in a team environment against the best juniors from other districts.

Format of play is both singles and doubles.



#### ~ The Inner Game of Tennis- Focusing ~

For our NWST juniors, the development of the inner game and the correct mindset is as important as the technical ability on court.

Focusing incessantly on UTR, worrying about the outcome of a match, what your parents may think if you perform below expectations, and thinking about what you are going to eat for dinner are all self-defeating.

Developing techniques to focus on the moment and move the mind away from those thoughts is critical.

Three techniques NWST is keen to share are:

- During points—concentrate on the seam of the tennis ball. This blocks out nervousness and other irrelevant objects of attention.
- 2. During points—internally count "1" for the ball bounce and "2" for ball contact. This also creates a rhythm in the shot, which creates consistency.
- Intense focus on the key times during a match.
  - Set up point 30-30, deuce
  - Set up game--4-4,5-5
  - Dictating games- first 2 games of second set
  - Lead Stretch- first game after you break serve
  - o Tiebreak- think of it as a mini set

Try these techniques out during your next match or during your coaching session. You will experience a real difference.

Orange ball competition focuses on:

- Basic stroke development on a smaller court with a slower bouncing ball.
- Rallying and court movement are critical.
- · Basic understanding of scoring.
- Basic understanding of tennis etiquette.



#### **Green Ball**

The inaugural Sunday JCS Green Ball Competition is well underway.

In tennis, playing green ball competition signifies a stage of development where:

- Players are focusing on transitioning to a full-size court and playing with a ball that bounces higher and faster than the "orange ball."
- Focuses on more advanced shot execution and court coverage on a full-sized court.
- Ability to accurately score becomes important as a prelude to yellow ball.
- Tennis head space becomes important.
- Tennis etiquette becomes more important.

NWST would like to thank the majority of parents on the relevant whats app groups for working together to find and allocate relevant substitutes. This ensures the competition runs smoothly.



- · Representatives following runners to collect gel packs














# Connecting with Environment ~ Whale Rock Fun Run~

Sit and relax while you wait, watch a match or view your son or daughter on the training court.






#### **Updated Defiberators**

The 2 defribrillators on our Pennant Hills tennis precinct have now been updated to include childrens pads. One defib is located in the main clubhouse. The second defib is located on the second level behind the mini club house at court 13.

There is signage at the front of the main clubhouse for when the main club house is closed. This directs participants to the second defibrillator.

The 1 defribrillator at our Epping precinct works differently, not requiring children pads but possessing a turn key to convert into a unit for children.


#### **Turfing**

#### President's Message



It's hard to believe we are in March already and 2025 is already well underway!

Cyclone Alfred is about to make landfall in south -east Queensland and Northern NSW as I write this message and our thoughts and prayers go out to the tennis playing community and the broader community in these areas as they brace for whatever the next few days throws their way.

NWST continues to "get ahead of the game" with the showcase Tildesley Tournament now in advanced stages of planning with the Independent Girls Schools Association (IGSA) once again choosing NWST as their venue of choice to host this prestigious event. The tournament runs from Wednesday 19 March through to Friday 21 March. Please consider how this tournament impacts on your own tennis arrangements. Thank you in advance to all the staff and volunteers who will make this tournament a success.

Our adult comps are underway again with finals rounds being played and planning for new comps underway. Term 1 Saturday Junior Comp (SJC) is also well underway with a particular focus being placed on consistent attendance for the benefit of all players. A new Orange ball (10under) and Green ball (12 under) comp is underway on a Sunday morning for juniors wanting a pathway to the Saturday Junior Comp which is a yellow ball comp. Thank you to the teams that successfully established this new comp and special mention to Voyager for trialling this with us.

Moving our attention to capital and maintenance items, courts 3 and 8 had their synthetic grass surfaces replaced just before Christmas and the special attention these courts require to get them to a more routine maintenance schedule is fast approaching. The additional sanding and brooming has ensured these two courts are at optimal playability despite being new surfaces. Well done to Andy P and team for getting them up to this standard.

Tildesley, being our first large tournament of the year, sets a timeline for improvements to be completed and the new sandstone blocks in front of courts 5 & 6 were timed with Tildesley in mind. If you remember, all the turf was removed when the blocks were installed. This turfed area is where the crowd watching the Tildesley finals rounds position themselves.

Through the tireless efforts of our CoM members Mel Dolahenty and Andy Kleiberg, supported by our maintenance team, they have both prepared the ground to receive the turf and then laid the turf through the hot summer. This turf has now established strong root growth and is looking awesome and will be ready on time for this first tournament.



Council of Management (CoM) continue to meet monthly and conduct business on behalf of the Association. In our most recent CoM an investment decision was made on replacing the Associations chair and members and players will start noticing the introduction of these new chairs. They are sturdy and have a maximum weight rating of above 150kg.

The Finance sub-committee has prepared our budget for the next financial year where a balance between income levels and expenditure is carefully managed. Thank you to our members and social players who have accepted the price increases in our proshop as this is an important revenue stream to allow continued re-investment in our great Association.

Our defibrillators are all undergoing service across both Midson Road and Pennant Hills and will shortly have the capability to support both pediatric and adult patients.

There has been quite a bit of grant activity with applications going in for a number of grant opportunities. Grants are such an important additional revenue stream to improve our facilities without having to fund these all from our association's reserves.

A very busy start to the year with much to do in 2025, including support of the inaugural Whale Rock Trail run, but with awesome and supportive members, social players, staff, CoM members and coaching partners, we're in a very good position to continue being successful this calendar year.
